Expect raves for this band that garnered "Best EP" from the Village Voice Pazz and Jop awards for In Search of Manny. With this full length debut, Luscious Jackson continues the promise of that recording. Signed to the Beastie Boys' label at Capitol, they offer a melange of rock, rap, and soul that meanders along with aplomb. Lead singers Jill Cunniff and Gabby Glaser trade off duties in each song: Typically, Cunniff rap/sings the intro and Glaser kicks in with a vicious hook somewhere along the way.

As on *Manny*, the album is frontloaded with all the good tracks, making *Natural Ingredients* seem like a classic for the first five or six songs. "Cityscape," the first single, is a template for what follows. Cunniff grooves above a great melody, chatting up bicycle messengers, warning corrupt cops that Serpico is still around, and then Glaser snaps in with "When I'm about to go crazy/Cause I'm still living here/I just get my friends together/And we dance, dance, dance."

Nothing earth-shaking, sure, but they deliver it with style. And song after song—"Deep Shag," "Energy Sucker," "Here"—clicks until they run out of steam about half way through. It may peter to a close, but there's big fun along the way. When Luscious Jackson pulls together enough solid tunes, they'll be the best band around. They're already one of the funnest.
