HEAD The Monkees (1968, Rhino, G. \$24.95) The brief moment when the Monkees were undeniably "with it." Their movie (masterminded by Bob Rafelson and Jack Nicholson, soon to deliver Five Easy Pieces) carried an antiwar message, poked fun at their manufactured selves. and featured cameos from the likes of Frank Zappa and Sonny Liston. The crucial difference between this trippy artifact and A Hard Day's Night? The Beatles had "Can't Buy Me Love"; the Monkees had "Porpoise Song." As one of Rhino's first DVDs (along with Walking Tall and In the World Tonight. a making-of documentary on Paul McCartney's Flaming Pie), it's disappointing, especially since the company's CDs are thoughtfully packaged. Though this disc contains a clean print and a clutch of trailers, there's no wide-screen option, an inaccurate chapter index, and no audio commentary from any principal, How busy can Micky Dolenz be?
