Ultimately, all a reader can do is ruthlessly reject most of the pieces and go steady with the few that catch the eye. I'll be returning the phone calls of Marcellus Hall, who drew a witty, two-page comic strip on "the lessons of a cyclical heart." I'll be flirting madly and suggesting drinks with Dan Savage, who tells a hilarious story about sleeping with a girl to try to avoid the fact that he's gay. And I'll heave a sigh of relief after reading Bob Kerrey's sweet, poignant story of falling in love with a girl in a photograph—finally, after all these guys and their issues, it's a pleasure to hear from an adult.
