When we last heard from Delvoye, he was making a splash with his "Artificial Cloaca," a system of tubes containing acids and enzymes which took gourmet meals in one end and passed excrement out the other. His latest masterpieces are even more ghoulish.

His irradiated models are seen kissing and performing more graphic acts, while his X-rays capture images of not only teeth and bone, but also muscle, sinew and the insides of veins. Delvoye also used low-level radia-

slathered genitals.

As anyone who has gone to the dentist nows, human organs are normally protected by a thick lead apron when exposed to cancer-causing X-rays for even an instant. But Delvoye's unfortunate models, male and female, took no such precautions while the beams passed through their most sensitive parts over and over again. When interviewed, the artist revealed a

when interviewed, the artist revealed a shocking lack of knowledge about the risks to which his subjects were exposed. "I was aware that the X-rays could cause a momentary drop in the fertility of my models," Delvoye told Webster Hall art curator Balrd Jones, "but the radiologists in Belgium who operated the X-ray machines assured me that the sperm counts would return to nor-mal in a few days. I even X-rayed my own genitals." he had considered that the radiation could cause birth defects. He said, "The fact that X-rays could cause genetic damage to the testicles or to the ovaries of my models never occurred to me until now. I should have thought of that."

Even his own wife's pregnancy didn't wake Delvoye up to the idea that radiation and the human reproductive system don't mix: "I never thought about birth defects, which is strange because my wife was pregnant while I was making this art. I just hope the models

Confronted with his own thoughtlessness, Delvoye chalked it up to his lackadaisical, European attitude toward life and death.

"Americans are much more conscious of health issues than in Belgium where, with art, we just let things happen," he said.
