lesser sequel, "Funny Lady."
Hepburn is represented by her
career-reviving triumph, 1940's
"The Philadelphia Story," and in
a separate, same-priced release,
the 1938 screwball comedy
"Bringing Up Baby."



I ♥ Huckabees★★½ Fox, \$27.98

"Huckabees" is an enjoyable comedy from director David O. Russell ("Three Kings") that doesn't quite work. But Dustin Hoffman and Lily Tomlin make a great comic team, Mark Wahlberg is hilarious and Jude Law uses his absurd good looks to amusing effect. The modest extras include two commentary tracks.

A Paralyzing Fear ★★★ First Run, \$24.95

This 1998 Emmy-winning documentary about polio combines new interviews and archival footage to tell the story one of the most successful battles ever waged against a disease. Also just out: "I'll Sing for You," the Jonathan Demme-produced documentary of Mali's most famous singer, Boubacar Traore (First Run, \$29.95). Extras include more legendary performances.
